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elcome to the 2022 Biamp PDX Jazz Festival! 719 – that is how many days have passed since we last welcomed a live audience to a Biamp PDX Jazz Festival show, and we are so happy to have you back. While we all moved to virtual entertainment options during COVID-19 to preserve a sense of normalcy, there is simply no substitute to celebrating the live musical experience as a communal gathering, a moment where joy, exhilaration, and awe collide.

PDX Jazz transitioned substantially during 2020 and 2021, moving quickly to build a robust digital experience for our jazz community. Our education programs moved online to facilitate remote learning without missing a step, we launched a new engaging interactive website featuring an array of exclusive content for PDX Jazz members, and debuted the PDX Jazz Radio Hour, our weekly show airing on KMHD 89.1 FM.

The 2021 Biamp PDX Jazz Festival was a monumental 10-day digital event featuring 31 live stream events, originating in 6 cities around the globe, and was viewed on 6 continents and watched in 24 countries by more than 13,000 viewers.

Our organization has learned a lot over the last 24 months, and we have added significant entertainment and arts education digital platforms to our offerings that will continue in perpetuity alongside live events and in classroom learning.

The PDX Jazz team continuously strives to present the most exciting artists in the world of jazz and associated genres, many whom you know and love, while introducing you to several artists whose music may be unfamiliar. The 2022 Biamp PDX Jazz Festival features three NEA Jazz Masters, seven GRAMMY® Award winners, and ten DownBeat rising stars. Each generation of musicians drawing inspiration from the music that preceded their arrival onto the scene, as well as events and artistic developments presently occurring in society, to craft a unique interpretation and expression of jazz. As the 2022 Festival unfolds, we encourage you to seek out a show by an emerging and intriguing artist, they may become your favorite of the Festival by the end of their show

We hold deep gratitude towards you, our audience, PDX Jazz members, and corporate and philanthropic partners who stood alongside us, sustaining PDX Jazz as the world navigated historical challenges. And, we are excited about our future, emerging from the pandemic and all of its effects as a stable and progressive organization with a promise to evolve and build a diverse and vast audience for jazz. IN OUR SCHOOLS AND COMMUNITY

PDX Jazz, a 501 (c)(3), fills the gap of reduced funding, and in many instances no funding for arts education in socio-economically disadvantaged communities. Our vouth education programs are different from typical arts education, in that we focus on music and cultural appreciation, concepts that are relevant to every student, musicians and nonmusicians alike. PDX Jazz operates multiple programs that explore America's indigenous music and its effect on American society.

√ Jazz and its Connection to Visual Art

Jazz in the Schools is a K-12 program that teaches students about jazz music's most important contributors, past and present, and its connection to visual art, a creative medium connecting to every student at every skill level. Students discover how the visual art associated with jazz plays a significant role in mirroring and shaping American culture by creating their own original jazz album cover, interpreting the music, its emotion and message as visual expression. This interactive learning experience uniquely combines music, visual art, and American history. Student artwork is exhibited annually at the Portland Art Museum.

The Musical Evolution of Jazz

The American Refrain: Jazz and Modern Music PDX Jazz brings 'live' jazz to schools across Portland during February (Black History Month) and April (Jazz Appreciation Month). A celebration of jazz, this hour-long performance with narration walks students through the tenets of the genre; building community, storytelling, fighting for social justice, and improvisation. The performance highlights the modern evolution of jazz and how it has shaped the music we listen to todav.

The Music and The Movement Diving into the connection between jazz, gospel, rhythm and blues, and the Civil Rights Movement, The Music and The Movement is a curriculum unit built for middle and high school social studies and music classrooms to broaden the understanding of the social importance of jazz. This unit includes lessons on The Civil Rights Movement, jazz, gospel, rhythm and blues, Mahalia Jackson, John Coltrane, and James Brown.

Providing Access to 'Live' Jazz

Bright Moments. which is funded entirely by individual gifts, provides access to PDX Jazz performances for low-income and disadvantaged youth participating in

PDX Jazz education programs, allowing students to witness the music in a 'live' setting, and inspiring students to perform music themselves. The fund, established by Roberto Lovato and Laura Golino de Lovato. was named "Bright Moments." which honors the great jazz musician Rahsaan Roland Kirk, whose tenacious spirit fashioned a brilliant career in jazz despite blindness and stroke. and who spoke passionately from the stage about Black history and civil rights. Kirk's everyday greeting in the face of major obstacles was "Bright Moments."



PDX Jazz Lectures are presented throughout the year. Each lecture explores a particular subject and its relation to jazz in-depth. Recent lectures have been on topics such as Women in Jazz, Jazz and the Civil Rights Movement, and The History of Recording Techniques. This series takes shape as Jazz Conversations and the "Behind the Boards" workshops and masterclasses during the annual Festival, offering fans intriquing discussions and learning opportunities on a myriad of topics with Festival artists.

Resources for Students. **Educators, and Inquiring Minds**

PDX Jazz desires to be a comprehensive resource in the realm of Virtual Jazz **Education**. In addition to our free in-school programs, we have a growing cache of free and downloadable online content on our website pdxjazz.org. From lesson plans and presentations to musician highlights, jazz playlists and read-aloud videos, we are dedicated to providing the most approachable and age-appropriate education resources for introducing students to jazz.





PDX Jazz Choir will launch in spring 2022, offering students an opportunity to perform in our newly created vocal ensemble. We intentionally choose the vocal choir format, which allows participation from every student, no musical training required.

Our education e-newsletter reaches teachers in Oregon, Washington, and Idaho, connecting PDX Jazz to 148 school districts, 1,989 schools, and 1,047,566 students; providing much-needed resources in rural communities.

Our education programs are offered at no cost to participants and reach 9.000+ underserved students annually in 8 counties - 14 school districts - 25 public schools, primarily Title 1A schools in Oregon and Washington, including Oregon Youth Authority schools and special education programs in the Northwest Regional Educational Service District. Among the students served: 65% receive free/reduced lunch, 57% are persons of color, 29% are English Language Learners and 15% are special needs children.





GARY BARTZ

Angel Bat Dawid

Angel Bat Dawid is a Black American Composer, Improviser, Clarinetist, Pianist, Vocalist, Educator & DJ. Her critically acclaimed Album "The Oracle", released by Chicago label International Anthem recorded using only her cell phone in various locations has caused a sensation and garnered comparisons to Nina Simone and Sun Ra.

Blue Cranes

Portland jazz ensemble Blue Cranes has long established itself as a forward-thinking entity. The quintet, made up of Reed Wallsmith on alto saxophone, Joe Cunningham on tenor saxophone, Rebecca Sanborn on keyboards, Jon Shaw on bass, and Ji Tanzer on drums, is steeped in the history and sound of the artists that came before them, but too curious and creative to simply replicate the past. Blue Cranes will be joined by Laura Gibson, Laura Veirs, and more in this special, all-ages, free performance to celebrate the release of Voices.

Brad Melhdau

One of the most lyrical and intimate voices of contemporary jazz piano, Brad Mehldau has forged a unique path, which embodies the essence of jazz exploration, classical romanticism and pop allure. From critical acclaim as a bandleader to major international exposure in collaborations with Pat Metheny, Renee Fleming, and Joshua Redman, Mehldau continues to garner numerous awards and admiration from both jazz purists and music enthusiasts alike.

Brandee Younger & Dezron Douglas

Harpist, composer, educator, and concert curator Brandee Younger--known for her work with Ravi Coltrane, Moses Sumney & Lauryn Hill - has brought the Harp into the 21st Century. Bassist, composer, bandleader, educator and 2019 DownBeat Magazine Rising Star Dezron Douglas has established himself as a major force in contemporary creative music.

Brown Calculus

Keyboardist and beat maker, Andre Burgos, and singer, songwriter Vaughn explore the soundscapes of the post-soul movement. Gemini duo, illuminating the sacredness of Black music with a cosmic sound that remains grounded and embodying the intergalactic values of jazz and unity.

Carlos Niño & Friends

Carlos Niño refers to himself musically, and in many aspects of his life, as a "Communicator." He considers his "presence, aura, energy field," his voice, and many collected instruments (a unique and colorful assortment of bells, chimes, cymbals, gongs, keyboards, shakers, shells, and more) among his essence and describes his "& Friends" sound as "a Spiritual, Improvisational, Space Collage."

Christian Scott aTunde AdJuah

Chief Christian Scott aTunde Adjuah is a two-time Edison Award winning and five-time GRAMMY® nominated musician, composer and producer. As part of the New Orleans Big Chief lineage, his holistic vision of music and education encompasses the generations that came before him and the generations he's inspiring today.

Chuck Israels

Local hero and 2022 PDX Jazz Master recipient, Chuck Israels is revered as one of the preeminent bassists in the world---having performed and recorded with Billie Holiday, Benny Goodman, Herbie Hancock, John Coltrane, Bud Powell, Coleman Hawkins, Stan Getz, Bill Evans, Rosemary Clooney, Tony Williams, Eric Dolphy, the Kronos String Quartet and countless others.

Darrell Grant feat. Rebecca Kilgore

The inaugural PDX Jazz Festival 'First Call' showcase features acclaimed Portland jazz musicians. After 25 years of calling Portland home, pianist, teacher, mentor, activist, composer Darrell Grant offers a rare solo performance inspired by the founders of our city's jazz scene. Acclaimed vocalist Rebecca Kilgore joins Darrell for the second set to remember the great Dave Frishberg. Both Darrell and Rebecca are PDX Jazz Master award recipients.

Diane Schuur

Long regarded as one of Contemporary Jazz's leading vocalists. Diane Schuur is as eclectic as she is brilliant. Born in Tacoma. Washington, Schuur was blind from birth: but she was gifted with perfect pitch a and three-and-a-half-octave vocal range. Eric Krasno + Son Little

Whether as a dynamic guitarist (Soulive, Tedeschi Trucks Band, or his own solo output) or award-winning producer (Norah Jones, Aaron Neville, Allen Stone), Eric Krasno has carved himself a seat at the table of top talents in contemporary music and he's bringing along budding classic-Soul / R&B superstar Son Little for an incredible night of music.

Flor de Toloache

Flor de Toloache the Latin GRAMMY® winning. New York-based ensemble is one of the finest all-female mariachi groups on the planet. The group began as a trio named for the delirium-inducing Mexican flower used as a love potion for generations. As it has grown in notoriety, the band has expanded to as many as ten members depending on the setting, forming a truly global ensemble with musicians hailing from Mexico, Puerto Rico, Dominican Republic, Cuba, Australia, Colombia, Germany, Italy, and the United States

Gary Bartz

Gary Bartz' influence can be felt all across modern music, from bebop to jazz-funk to hip hop, while his resolute stance on social justice reamins as fiery as ever. Starting in the 60's as a hired gun for the likes of Eric Dolphy, Max Roach and Abbey Lincoln, Art Blakey's Jazz Messengers, or Miles Davis himself, on to most recently as a leader on the Adrian Younge & Ali Shaheed Mohammed's "Jazz is Dead" series. Bartz remains a cutting edge figure even entering the 7th decade of his career

Immanuel Wilkins

The music of saxophonist and composer Immanuel Wilkins is filled with empathy and conviction, bonding arcs of melody and lamentation to pluming gestures of space and breath. Listeners were introduced to this riveting sound with his acclaimed debut album Omega, which was named the #1 Jazz Album of 2020 by The New York Times.

James Brandon Lewis & **Chad Taylor**

James Brandon Lewis is a criticallyacclaimed composer, saxophonist, and writer. He has been described as "a saxophonist who embodies and transcends tradition" by The New York Times. Chad Taylor is a composer, educator, percussionist and scholar who is a co-founder of the Chicago Underground ensembles.

Julana Torres' La Colorá

Julana Torres is a multifaceted artist gracing Portland and national stages for over 25 years. As a classically trained dancer, singer and actor. .Julana's versatility as a performer, paired with her Puerto Rican roots, engages audiences in an unforgettable rhythmic experience. John Carroll Kirby

John Carroll Kirby is an American pianist. producer and composer based in Los Angeles. As a solo artist he has released 6 LPs, as well as an in-demand collaborator with such artists as Solange, Frank Ocean & Norah Jones.

Laufev

Half Chinese and half Icelandic, Laufey spent much of her childhood inspired in part by her mother, a classical violinist, taking up piano and cello early on, but it was her father's collection of Ella Fitzgerald and Billie Holiday albums that spoke to her on a deeper level. After landing a prestigious Presidential Scholarship to the Berklee College of Music, Laufey moved to Boston, where she began writing her own songs blending sophisticated jazz melodies and slow-burning R&B grooves.

Makava McCraven

Makaya McCraven a beat scientist, the bleeding edge drummer, producer, and sonic collagist is one of Chicago's savviest cultural players and a multi-talented force whose inventive process & intuitive, cinematic style defy categorization. With his new remix album, Deciphering The Message, he digs through the vaults of the legendary jazz label Blue Note Records to put a modern bounce on classics by Art Blakey, Horace Silver and more.

Marc Ribot

Enigmatic quitarist Marc Ribot nearly 4-decade career has seen 6 verv diverse solo quitar albums, as well as collaborations with the likes of John Zorn and Tom Waits. His live solo performances are unpredictable events which may draw on all of these or none, creating a sonic matrix of memory, free improvisation, zeitgeist, extra-terrestrial radio signals. and much more

Mariachi Tradición

Mariachi Tradición is an audition based ensemble from Forest Grove High School. Led by educator and musician Lesslie Nuñez, the group is committed to preserving and growing the beautiful tradition of Mariachi to the next generation of Pacific NW youth.

Marquis Hill

From his beginnings as one of Chicago's most thrilling young trumpeters, to his current status as an internationally renowned musician. composer bandleader. Marguis Hill has worked tirelessly to break down the barriers that divide musical genres. Contemporary and classic jazz, hip-hop, R&B, Chicago house, neo-soul-to Hill, they're all essential elements of the profound African-American creative heritage he's a part of.

Max Ribner

Perhaps Portland's most iconic all-star band-with each member widely viewed as tops in the Northwest on his respective instrument-has been a sensation for a long while now. With a collective resume that reads like a "Who's Who" of jazz, blues, and soul, all four members are Oregon Music Hall of Fame inductees - Dan Balmer (guitar), Louis Pain (B-3 organ), Renato Caranto (sax) and the Godfather of Portland Jazz himself, drummer Mel Brown, who welcomes his son, multi-instrumentalist, Christopher Brown as a special featured guest.

Mndsqn

Mndsgn, aka Ringgo Ancheta, is one of SoCal's top up and coming producers, having put out 3 records on the acclaimed Stones Throw Label. From early on, Ringgo has aimed to explore the human condition in his music. Taken as a whole, his body of work chronicles the evolution of self, asking throughout: how can we live in a way that is true to ourselves? How can we find beauty in the everyday and unfamiliar?

Nate Smith + KINFOLK

One of the foremost faces of the current progressive jazz movement, 2x GRAMMY® nominated composer & producer Nate Smith has become one of the most sought after drummers in the world today, backing the likes of Brittany Howard, Pat Metheny, Ravi Coltrane and more. Now through his own project KINFOLK, Nate's powerful take on Black American music, is set to see him become a star in his own right.

Omari Jazz

Omari Jazz is a producer, composer and visual artist currently based in Portland, Oregon. Best known for his debut record Dream Child. Omari Jazz reaches for a sound somewhere between familiar and science fiction.

Robert Glasper

Robert Glasper is the leader of a new sonic paradigm with a career that bridges musical and artistic genres and generations. A multiple GRAMMY® & Emmy winner for his music, he's also an award winning film composer and producer, collaborating with some of the most important artists of our time---from Kendrick Lamar & Stevie Wonder to Ava Duvernay & Dave Chappelle. His "Black Radio" series of albums has

been monumental in shaping the direction of things to come and we're honored to have him present the vol 3 preview of the project on this year's festival.

Sasha Berliner

Sasha Berliner is a musician, composer, producer, and band leader from San Francisco now based in New York. Sasha released her debut alternative jazz album, Azalea featured by Jazz at Lincoln Center. Sasha was the 2020 DownBeat Critics' Poll winner of the "Rising Star Vibraphone" category. She was both the first woman, and at 21, was the youngest individual in the poll's history to be granted the win.

Tahirah Memory

Portland native, singer, songwriter Tahirah Memory, raised by a willful, loving and resourceful mother, and shaped at an early age by the vibration and melodic hands of her jazz trumpeter father, asserted her love for music extremely early in her childhood. Tahirah's sound, steeped in jazz, soul and R&B is unlike any other, sounding distinctly like her personal truth.

The Cookers

The Cookers achieve the often cited by rarely embodied term "Super Group. This exciting all-star ensemble of Billy Harper, Cecil McBee, George Cables, David Weiss, Eddie Henderson, and 2021 NEA Jazz Masters Billy Hart and Donald Harrison Jr. summons up an aggressive mid '60s spirit with a potent collection of expansive post-bop originals marked by all the requisite killer instincts and pyrotechnic playing.

The Soul Rebels

The Soul Rebels started with an idea - to expand upon the pop music they loved on the radio and the New Orleans brass tradition they grew up on. They took that tradition and blended funk and soul with elements of hip hop, jazz and rock all within a brass band context. The band has built a career around an eclectic live show that harnesses the power of horns and drums in a deep pocket funk party-like atmosphere.

Weedie Braimah

Widely regarded as the premiere voice of the Diembe. Born in Ghana and raised in East St. Louis with deep roots in New Orleans, Braimah descends from a long lineage of drummers and composers and ushers listeners through a rhythmic journey of Africa and the Diaspora. The GRAMMY® nominated Diembefola records and tours with Christian Scott aTunde Adjuah, Baaba Maal, Trombone Shorty and also leads his own band, Weedie Braimah & The Hands of Time

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
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






















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
